7 THE EDITOR IS ON THE LOOSE! - BY MEL SUAREZ

7.1 WING-LOADING LUST

Went to fly with Dan Micalizzi. I had an underpowered Timber that weighs little and so was a bit hesitant to fly in the wind. He had a classic nitro, shoulder-mounted-wing aircraft with which he tore up the skies doing huge, steady loops, Immelmann's and the like. It was fast and sleek – and sounded great, BTW.

So, I said "I bet you the wing loading on your plane is twice that of mine."

He was flying his Easy Sport with a nitro size 40 – his 3rd one! He loves them. It has a slight dihedral and he says that Ray used to say: "This is the 2nd plane someone would want to get after they've been flying the LT-40 for a year." That was a while ago.

So I decided to do some math. Below is a wing-loading calculator where wing loading (D2) is defined simply as weight over wing area (=B2/C2*144) converted from square inches to square feet. Column F shows the effect of adding a battery or fuel, F =(B2+E2)*144/(C2)

Sure enough, the Big Guy (me) was wrong. The Easy Sport comes in at 16.9 lbs/sq ft while the Timber is 12.9. So, not 2-to-1, but the Easy Sport has indeed 30% heavier wing-loading.

By the way, I read that 30% nitro fuel weight is 1 oz per oz of fuel approximately, so that is what I used for the conversion. Close enough. If anyone would like the spreadsheet, send me a note.

Just for grins, I included Dan's big Cub in the analysis at 20 lbs with floats. The wing loading is quite high at 26 oz/sq ft. That is indeed a heavy plane. More than 2x the wing-loading of the timber.

Another factor in penetrating the wind, of course, is thrust-to-weight ratio. Measuring thrust is a little tricky but for grins I'll be looking to see if Dan's aircraft (and mine) can climb vertically. That will tell us that it's at least greater than 1.

7.2 4-POINT ROLL......FINALLY!

A lot of seasoned pilots will roll their eyes (no pun intended) when the read that it's taken me 47 years to learn to do the 4-point roll. What! Seriously???

Many pilots just want to fly, to dance in the sky. I actually can do quite a few things – inverted flight, stall turns, rolls, snap rolls, knife-edge, loops, rolls, etc. I particularly like the hammerhead stall. So, I posted this on our Facebook page when I found it quite difficult to do a 4-point roll.

How critical is it for aerobatics to put yourself in the cockpit mentally?

I'm working on the 4-pt roll and it seems like I'm going to have to force the issue.

Otherwise, I would have to memorize the sequence.

The answers varied but here's an answer from Yaz:

You don't need to put yourself inside.

Baby steps...

1st Learn each maneuver independently straight down the runway... knife edge both directions and inverted. If you don't have each part down, you'll never get it all together nicely. Get on the sim and practice knife edge all night in both directions. Trust me don't even do one 4 point roll yet.. Once you can fly around knife edge figure 8s for a few days in both direction and inverted for a entire flight nice and straight then think about the 4 point roll. Then remember start with the slow roll first!

I did NOT do what Yaz suggested such as KE figure 8's, but I was able to post this:

Ok, guys, thanks for the inputs. Got the 4-pt roll going pretty good now. Just need to practice it. The last step for me was to avoid having elevator input while going into knife edge. Took me a while to figure that out.

Feels VERY COOL to have such a basic maneuver down after flying RC for 2022-1975=47 years! It just wasn't important enough to me.

BTW, for those who are following this thread - i can fly inverted and in KE indefinitely in all directions on the sim. In the field -- that's another matter. LOL

Neil Cumbie - eFlite Extra 300 3D 1.3m - on the sim. Outside I'll be doing the 4-pt roll w/ my Horizon E-Flite Sukhoi SU-29mm (Gen 2).

I'll certainly by doing it on the Timber as well but it will certainly be ugly (or uglier). \overleftrightarrow

Way to go Mel! As you've learned and many don't understand, a 4 Pt roll "looks" basic but to do it well and accurately and consistently is nothing basic! Congrats. Practice and fly with a purpose. We need to get you out to an IMAC contest to: observe, shadow or participate in Novice or Basic class. Consider it with your new appreciation of precise model flying! 


